



What is the Pupil Premium Grant?



This grant is an amount of money allocated to schools based on the number of the most disadvantaged children each school has.



Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium Grant as they feel is appropriate. Schools must report and publicise annually how the money has been spent and what the impact has been made on the achievements of the pupils.



Funding for 2025-26 is £1515 per 'disadvantaged children' and £2630 per child who is looked after or adopted from care.

Who are the 'most disadvantaged children?'

This is a government definition; it includes children who

have had free school meals, due to low income at any point in the school life

are 'looked after' by the local authority

adopted from care

are children of Service families




Although not included in the calculation of funds (and therefore do not qualify for the personalised budget) this also includes pupils who

have ever had a social worker


have special educational needs and /or disabilities
