Orienteering: Children will begin to understand what a key is and associate symbols with PE equipment. This will lay the foundations for reading orienteering maps in UKS2.

8 Points of a Compass: North, South, East, West, North East, North West, South East, South West

Coordinates: are a set of numbers or numbers and letters together that show you a position on a map. They can help you find a place or object that you are looking for. Children will link their learning from maths to locate points on a grid using co-ordinates.
