Must—know knowledge

- Understand the choices we have when it comes to money.
- Why should I save money?
- How is money used online?
- How is data used online? What is advertising?
- What is reliable and how do I fact check?
- Understand some of the decisions we need to make around spending, saving, and giving money.
- When crossing the road, use the Green Cross Code: find a safe place to cross; stop, look and listen; let traffic pass; and do not run.
- Fire hazards include candles, cooking and electrics (plugs). In case of a fire, get out of the building and stay out—remember to stay low.
- To keep safe around water, stay away from the edge, follow the water safety rules and be aware of hidden dangers.



Fire Safety

<p>Never play with matches or lighters.</p> <p>They can be very dangerous and you could be badly burned.</p>	<p>Make sure that there are smoke alarms in your home.</p> <p>Test them every week and change their batteries regularly.</p>
<p>If you see smoke or a fire, tell a grown-up straight away.</p> <p>If you are inside a building, get out as quickly as you can.</p>	<p>If your clothes catch on fire:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Stop what you are doing. 2) Drop to the ground. 3) Roll on the floor to put out the fire.
<p>Talk to your family about a fire escape plan.</p> <p>Plan the quickest and safest way out of your home if there is a fire.</p>	<p>In the event of an emergency, call 999 and ask for the fire service.</p> <p>Only call 999 if there is a real emergency.</p>

S	Stay safe online by not sharing personal information	
M	Do not meet anyone who you have only made friends with online	
A	Do not accept messages or friend requests from strangers	
R	Not everything online is reliable . Some people online are strangers and may try and trick us	
T	Tell an adult you trust if anything happens online that you don't like
